Dear Neighborhood Association President,

As we strive to continue to serve our neighborhoods more efficiently, we ask that you help us spread the message on the proper way to set out our Waste Management carts (Herbie, Rosie, and Lenny).

Please pass on to your residents the following message:

Help us serve you!

- Please place waste management carts (Herbie, Rosie and Lenny) on the curb, the evening before your collection day, after 4pm.
- Please allow 3 feet of space between each cart, and set them away from mailboxes or light poles, with the handle facing your home. We service the carts with trucks equipped with automated arms which need the extra space around each cart to grab it.
- Extra cardboard should be flattened, bundled and placed besides your Rosie recycling cart.
- If you are using bags for yard waste, please only use paper bags and place those on the curb, too.
- Please don't place items on top of the cart lids, and don't park your car in front of the carts.

Every week, the city's Division of Waste Management sends 4 different trucks to your neighborhood to serve you. One will empty the Herbie, one will collect the Rosie and bundled cardboard, one will collect the Lenny and/or yard waste bags, and one will collect bulky items or overflow items. By following these instructions, we will be able to serve you, our customers, more efficiently.

In the last few months the Lexington Fire Department has received several complaints. Apparently, a male subject has been approaching citizens, asking for financial assistance, claiming his home burned down "over off Harrodsburg Rd around midnight." The Fire Department has found that all of these claims are false.

The Lexington Fire Department would also like you to know that this set of circumstances would be unlikely. The Fire Department coordinates with the local Red Cross and several other charitable agencies when someone's home is damaged by fire. These organizations provide food, clothing and housing for the victims for several days after the event, allowing them to get their affairs in order. The Red Cross attends to these issues while the Fire Department is still on scene extinguishing the blaze. There simply would be no need to begin asking for help a few hours after a home was destroyed or damaged by fire.
